A Word From The President

I am often asked my friends and even sometimes by fellow members: What is there to do in the mountains besides playing golf? I believe this is widely not understood. Playing golf and our wonderful golf course will remain our crown jewel of the club but, there are many other "things to do" for everyone from kids to older adults. I know everyone is aware that tennis, swimming and walking trails are available at High Meadows. Our club's 800 acres of property are adjacent to Camp Cheerio and Stone Mountain State Park (which is 14,000 acres). We have had a long time strong relationship with Camp Cheerio as many of our member's kids and grandkids have attended over the years and regularly attend their outstanding 4th of July festivities. In addition, we have had at least 2 members who have served on the Board of Directors at Camp Cheerio over the years – Carter Holbrook and Bill Ervin. Stone Mountain State Park offers hiking, camping, fishing/fly fishing and mountain biking activities and the park entrance is only 5 miles away.

Some other points of interest:

- ✧ Area wineries – There is a growing list of local wineries and you can tour, taste and go to events for music, car shows, dinners, etc. We are becoming the Napa Valley of the East Coast!
 - ✧ Blue Ridge Parkway – the parkway is only 3 miles north of our entrance and offers 460+ miles of wonderful views, picnic areas, camping and other side adventures.
 - ✧ Virginia Creeper Trail – an old railroad bed that has been converted to a biking/walking trail with scenic views and vistas.
 - ✧ The New River offers kayaking and rafting on various levels of rapids for beginners to more advanced.

 - ✧ Various potteries and other artisan interests are available for tours and purchases

Pros Corner

1. Reminder:

As we enter into the golf season and play continues to increase, please be cautious while using the golf course to get home or to a friends. We have had a couple instances that members were teeing off and noticed someone crossing or using the course to get to a destination. Please be careful and use good judgement as we do not want anyone hurt!

2. Tip of The Month:

A putting routine that sets you up to make a positive stroke is a must. I want you to adapt the Analyze – Apply approach. While others are putting or before you take your stance, take time to assess the putt; slope, break, and speed. Once you have Analyzed the putt you are ready to go. Get set up to your ball, take a final look at the hole, and Apply what you learned earlier to make the putt. From the moment you commit to the putt I recommend 15 seconds from setup to stroke. Spend some time on the practice green with someone timing how long it takes you to hit the putt. What I want you to avoid is getting over the putt and continuing to analyze instead of thinking about holing it.

3. Dress Code Reminder:

Ladies - Modest sleeved or sleeveless shirt/top with or without collar; pants, capris, skorts, or shorts of appropriate length. Short shorts or cropped tops are not permitted.

Men - Collared shirt, turtleneck must be tucked in. Short shorts, tennis shorts, or cutoffs as well as denim is not permitted.

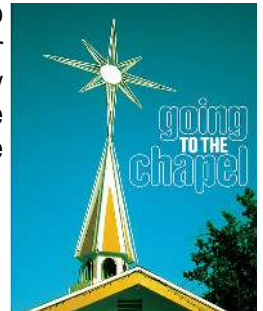
High Meadows Chapel
